# Adaptive Learning

## **Current Implementation**

Ensuring that proper support is in place for all students continues to be a focus. We have spent time as a staff analyzing data from our M.A.P. Growth sessions (Measures of Academic Progress) to identify areas where we may need to adjust and adapt to meet the needs of the students in our classrooms. Plans are currently underway to renovate and revitalize classrooms in our north wing, ensuring that our classroom spaces are updated and conducive to learning. Improvements include re-evaluating and upgrading the technology available to enhance instruction.



## **Current Implementation**

We have continued to find ways to ensure our students flourish knowing they are an integral part of our community. The entire school participated in a Cultural Day where students were invited to share their cultural heritage. Our teachers were given resources to help facilitate grade-appropriate conversations about ethnic and racial experiences and identities.

Speaker, Jeff A.D. Martin has been invited to speak to our students about diversity, inclusion, self-value, and self-worth with the hope of developing empathy in each one of us.

This year we have expanded our Track and Field "Family" tradition by having these cross-grade teams spend time together from the very beginning of the school year. Once a month, each team wears its "team colour" for the day and meets

for lunch to inspire a spirit of belonging through eating together and getting to know each other a little better.



# **Invested Community**

## **Current Implementation**

It has been another busy year so far for our Community Connection Team. We began the year with our annual BBQ and Open House and welcomed so many new families to John Knox!

Our Christmas Market was a big hit within our school community and allowed us to make connections with our broader community, welcoming them into our building.

Our Winter Walk at Conservation Park kicked off the Christmas Break, providing another opportunity to gather as a community to enjoy the crisp winter air and fellowship over a nice cup of hot chocolate!

Many families attended a Raptors 905 game together in March.

On a smaller scale, there have been numerous opportunities for parents to come together as volunteers to help out at the school and beyond the school walls. We see and celebrate our growing John Knox community and the connections that continue to bless us as a school.

# **Becoming Disciples**

## **Current Implementation**

At the start of this school year, each class was challenged to think of a way to serve their community. Many have already reached out to bless others, from putting together and delivering gift bags to seniors, organizing a food drive for vulnerable families in our community, and demonstrating stewardship by planting trees in a nearby park.

At our BBQ and Open House, each student chose a "prayer rock" with the name of a student or staff member written on it. The hope is that they would keep that person in their prayers throughout the year. We have also installed a "Prayer Tree" in our lobby area where anyone can write a prayer request and tape it to the branches of the tree. Classes are invited to visit the tree and pray for those who have posted requests.

Plans are set for next year to move towards deepening each child's knowledge of who they are and what part they will play in God's Story through the 'Teaching for Transformation' framework. It is our deep hope that all of our students will learn and develop a servant heart and their educational journey will be rooted in God's plan for each one of them.

As exciting as these developments have been, we remain focused on moving forward, implementing each of our themes to their fullest, and ensuring that we fulfill our mission and vision. We know God continues to watch over us and guide us as we strive to develop servant hearts in each of our students so they shine and truly see themselves in God's story.
